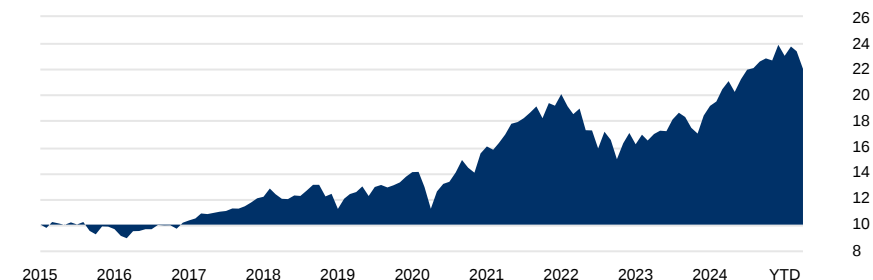

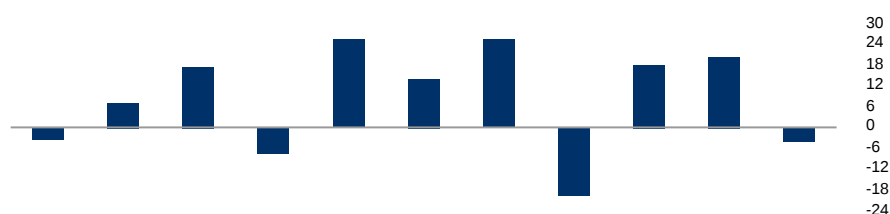
Performance analysis for Series A as of March 31, 2025

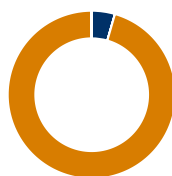
